Thank you for your support in ensuring that we have staggered drop-off and pick-up times.

We will be changing the way children enter school from **Monday 28th September 2020**. We will not be using the Beckett's Field gate and all the children will be entering and leaving via the main entrance gate.

Your staggered time remains the same and you are able to drop siblings off at the same time -remember the earliest drop-off time and the latest pick-up time please.
8:45am – Class 2(Miss Medley) and Class 4(Miss House)

9am – Class 1(Mrs Osborne/ Mrs Smith) and 3(Mrs Owuor)

As we are all using the same gate it will be really important to ensure that you arrive at your drop off and pick up time and not before.

We have made this decision in preparation for a change in the weather, Becketts's Field will soon be muddy, but also to respect the wishes of The Beckett's Recreation Ground Committee asking us not to use this entrance.

Could I politely ask that parents refrain from parking cars in the Beckett's Recreation Ground car park to drop off and pick children up as the car park is for the use of Beckett's Field and not Nawton Community Primary School.

Unfortunately, as is so often the case at this time of year, we have a number of children absent with a throat infection/ head cold. Providing you believe your child is well enough, and they do not have 1 or more of the coronavirus symptoms, they can attend school.

Symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19):

- a high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

If your child has 1 or more of the symptoms you will need to book a test and your household isolate for 14 days or until you receive a negative test result. If your child's result is positive they will need to self-isolate for 10 days and the rest of the household for 14 days.

Attendance:

Regular and punctual school attendance is important. Pupils need to attend school regularly if they are to take full advantage of the educational opportunities available to them by law. The last published national average for school attendance was 97%. Nawton Community Primary School's attendance target is 97%.

Our attendance for the academic year to date is 97%.
